Associate Pastor's Column

Dear friends,

A good friend recently shared with me a poetic American Indian Proverb, and it goes like this: "Tell me, and I will forget, Show me, and I may not remember. Involve me, and I will understand." I like the simplicity and

wisdom here, and how it applies to our lives as followers of Jesus Christ, which is all about God *involving* us.

On our most recent mission trip to Guatemala over Spring Break, we experienced how God involves us in ways that are bigger and wider than we sometimes think. We came to a greater understanding of how St. Andrew's involvement brought new life to a particular congregation. As you may recall, last year's trip involved funding and beginning the construction of a new roof for the small Iglesia Monte Sión. While this year's team was involved in a similar project for another church, Iglesia Esmirna, we were invited to a special worship service of thanksgiving down the road at Iglesia Monte Sión. In inviting us to worship with them, they wanted us to experience just how grateful they are for our connection and for what we were involved in together last year. They wanted us to know how we gave their congregation a spark, a nudge, a healthy dose of motivation to move forward and take new steps of faith. Something big happened with their understanding because of our involvement.

Sometimes it's easy to think our ministry efforts are fruitless or unsuccessful, especially when we don't see results or understand how God may be at work. Henri Nouwen offered these words about our involvement in God's work: "The mystery of ministry is that we have been chosen to make our own limited and very conditional love the gateway for the unlimited and unconditional love of God." This is a humbling mystery that certainly keeps us on our toes, eager to see God touch lives in new and unexpected ways.

I also believe God hopes our ministry efforts in this world will echo the incarnational way God is with us, at we will not just tell people about Christ, and not just show people either. I think God wants us to involve others and be with and for others, so that they too will understand "the breadth and length and height and depth" of God's love for us, Ephesians 3:14-21. May we come to a greater understanding of who God is and what God is doing as we keep involving each other in Christ's church—in this time and place, here and now.
